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Humble Area Assistance Ministries Raise the Roof Chili Cook-Off & Concert Rules and Regulations

1. The number of chili cooks is limited to entry forms and fees received by February 28, 2010.
2. Entry fee is \$25.00 per team/individual. All participants/cooks will receive t-shirts.
3. Chili is to consist of any kind of meat, beans, vegetables or combinations thereof, cooked with chili peppers, spices and other ingredients with the exception of any type of pasta.
4. Event staff will be at the Civic Center at 9:00 A.M. on Feb. 28 to assist with check-in. Cooking areas must be completely set up by 12:00 P.M. the day of the event. No electrical outlets will be provided for outdoor cookers.
5. Onsite outdoor preparation involving the use of props and vehicles may not exceed the boundary of the assigned space: 18'x20'. All tent structures or canopies must be secured with a portable security device. Boring or drilling of holes into concrete for spikes is prohibited. Provide a functioning fire extinguisher, rated at least 2A-10BC and must operate within Harris County's health, Fire and Public Safety Guidelines.
6. Entrants using crock pots and cooking indoors will be provided a 6- 8' table and electrical outlets. Bring your own extension cords that will be taped to the carpet.
7. Indoor and outdoor participants will receive bowls and spoons for serving chili to attendees. Chili will be served during the event until it runs out.
8. During check in, each entrant will be asked to sign a receipt for an assigned number that will be placed on the bottom of a 32oz. judging cup. The cup is to be delivered to the judges promptly at 2:00 P.M. and will identify the participant.
9. Judges will select a winning chili based on taste, texture, consistency, blend of spices, aroma, and originality. Judging rules are attached. People's choice award will be selected by attendees who purchase chili and vote for their favorite entry. The entry receiving the most votes will be the winner. All winners will be announced at 2:30 PM and receive trophies.
10. It is the responsibility of the entrants to see that their area is kept clean and safe. All fires must be put out and building materials/props hauled away and all equipment removed from the site at the end of the event. Containers will be provided for trash and refuse.
11. HAAM representatives and the Humble Civic Center will not be responsible for any accidents, theft, or mishaps.
12. This is not an officially sanctioned cook off.
